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Brief History of the College



Even after six decades of attaining political independence the peripheral areas of our state are deprived of the lights of higher education. The Ranibandh block is one of those areas. The lofty hills and the sprawling dense forest have made it inaccessible. To respect the rights to education of the people from the periphery of West Bengal a college was established in this block, vide order no. 970–Edn(A)/10M–57/13 dated 30/10/2013 under the auspices of Government of West Bengal known as Government General Degree College at Ranibandh.

The academic activities were inaugurated from the session 2015-2016. In the academic session 2015-2016, the college began its journey with six subjects of humanities: Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Santali, History and Education as 3-years honours subjects. In addition to this, the college also offers the general course in Humanities. The College is affiliated to the Bankura University from the academic session 2017- 18. Before 2017-18 the college was affiliated to The University of Burdwan.

From 2016-2017 academic session, Physics was introduced as 3-years of honours subject. Though the college has 3 departments for science but only the general courses associated with the Physics Honours course are taught here. No independent general course curriculum for science is offered to the students yet.

The College has a sizeable 5-acre campus with a three storied building. The spacious and sprawling campus of the college with its lawns and garden gives a healthy & student-friendly environment keeping in view the all-round development of the students. Different cultural programmes, observation of special days, keep the students engaged in socio-cultural activities. The college also upholds seminars, lectures, workshops, sports activities, N.S.S and other co-curricular activities for the wellbeing of the students. There are two separate students' common rooms respectively for boys and girls. A canteen is set up for the sake of both the students and teachers. Several scholarships and financial support are provided to the meritorious and needy students.

On the ground floor, the college library provides ample opportunities to explore the world of books and hence, the knowledge. There are well-equipped laboratories for Chemistry and Physics. Moreover, the college has set up two virtual classrooms and a laboratory for Mathematics too. Two Virtual cum Smart Class rooms with projector, internet facilities, audio-visual facility are available. The college has an IQAC, as a mechanism to build and

ensure a quality culture in the college. The college, overall, gives an encouraging and supportive environment to the students to spread their wings for their future success.

Being far away from the urban amenities the students of this college have to face lots of hurdles and hardships. Riding on a strong willpower and unflagging enthusiasm, they overcome all these hardships. In the previous two sessions we, the teachers, have always put our best foot forward to help them find a solution to the hardships they encounter. Our aim was, is and will forever be, to build a healthy, joyful and unhindered ambience for the students to help them in their pursuit of knowledge and wisdom.

মহাবিদ্যালয়ের সংক্ষিপ্ত ইতিহাস



স্বাধীনতার পর দীর্ঘ ছয় দশক অতিবাহিত হবার পরও, আমাদের রাজ্যের প্রান্তিক অঞ্চলগুলি ছিল উচ্চশিক্ষার সমস্ত সুযোগ-সুবিধা থেকে বঞ্চিত। তেমনই এক অঞ্চল বাঁকুড়া জেলার প্রান্তস্থিত রানিবাঁধ ব্লক। দুর্গম এই প্রদেশ পাহাড় আর দূরপ্রসারী অরণ্যে ঘেরা। রাজ্যের প্রান্তিক মানুষের উচ্চশিক্ষার অধিকারকে মর্যাদা দিয়ে ২০১৩ সালের ৩০ অক্টোবর (নির্দেশক্রম: 970 – Edn (A)/10M – 57/13 তারিখ: 30/10/2013) পশ্চিমবঙ্গ রাজ্য সরকার কর্তৃক বাঁকুড়া জেলার রানিবাঁধ ব্লকে একটি সরকারি কলেজ প্রতিষ্ঠিত হয়। ‘রানিবাঁধ সরকারি মহাবিদ্যালয়’ নামে পরিচিত এই কলেজের পঠন-পাঠনশুরু হয় ২০১৫-১৬ শিক্ষাবর্ষ থেকে।

২০১৫-১৬ শিক্ষাবর্ষে, এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ে বাংলা, ইংরেজি, সংস্কৃত, সাঁওতালি, ইতিহাস ও শিক্ষাবিজ্ঞান মানবিকীবিদ্যালয় অন্তর্ভুক্ত এই পাঁচটি বিষয়ে সাম্মানিক স্নাতক বিভাগের পঠন-পাঠন শুরু হয়। মানবিকীবিদ্যালয় সাধারণ স্নাতকের পঠন-পাঠন-ও শুরু হয় এই শিক্ষাবর্ষ থেকেই। ২০১৬-১৭ শিক্ষাবর্ষ থেকে পদার্থবিদ্যালয় সাম্মানিক স্নাতক বিষয়ক পঠন-পাঠন শুরু হয়।

প্রথম দুটি শিক্ষাবর্ষে এই মহাবিদ্যালয় ছিল বর্ধমান বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের অন্তর্ভুক্ত। ২০১৭-১৮ শিক্ষাবর্ষ থেকে এই মহাবিদ্যালয় বাঁকুড়া বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের অন্তর্ভুক্ত হয়েছে। প্রায় ৫ একর জুড়ে ব্যাপ্ত এই কলেজের প্রাঙ্গণ। কলেজের ত্রিতল ভবনটি রয়েছে একটি কেন্দ্রীয় গ্রন্থাগার, বীক্ষণাগার এবং আধুনিক ও যান্ত্রিক সুবিধায়ুক্ত একটি সুপারিসর শ্রেণিকক্ষও। কলেজ প্রাঙ্গণের মধ্যেই রয়েছে ক্যান্টিন, সাংস্কৃতিক অনুষ্ঠানের জন্য মুক্তমঞ্চ ও অন্যান্য সুযোগ-সুবিধাও। সারা বছর ধরেই কলেজের ছাত্রছাত্রীরা নানান সাংস্কৃতিক অনুষ্ঠানের আয়োজন করে।

নাগরিক সুযোগ-সুবিধা থেকে বঞ্চিত এই কলেজের ছাত্র-ছাত্রীরা বহু অনিবার্য সমস্যাকে শিরোধার্য করে শুধুমাত্র তাদের অপারিসীম ইচ্ছাশক্তি আর উৎসাহকে সম্বল করে নিয়েই নানান আপাত-সমস্যাগুলিকে অতিক্রম করে যেতে চেয়েছে। বিগত দুটি শিক্ষাবর্ষে তাদের সমস্যাগুলির সমব্যথী হয়ে সেই সমস্যার সমাধান খোঁজারও যথাসম্ভব চেষ্টা করেছে আমরা এবং তাদের পঠন-পাঠনের পক্ষে সুস্থ, সুন্দর ও বাধাহীন একটি পরিবেশ-ও আমরা নির্মাণ করতে চেয়েছি।

The same key opens the gates of hell.” Quoting these words in his book *The Meaning of It All* Feynman commented: “And so it is

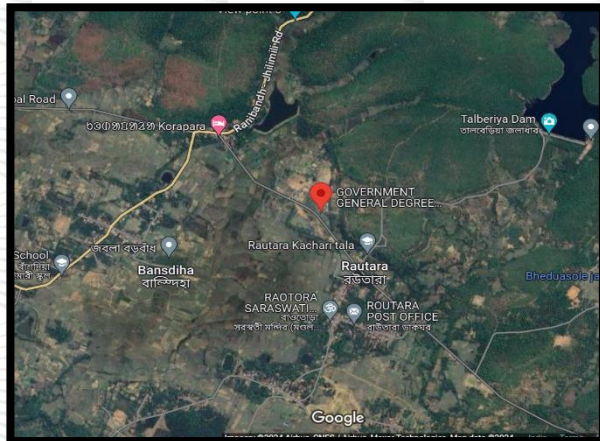

Jhilmili is a nearby comparatively central area and it is located at about 30 kilometers away from Mukutmanipur; 76 kilometers from the district headquarters Bankura, 36 kilometers from the sub-divisional town Khatra, and 2 Km from Ranibandh. This college is 76 Km away from Bankura City and 65 Km away from Jhargram by road.

DEPARTMENTS

The college has 9 undergraduate departments combining both the arts and science disciplines, where six major courses (Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Santali, Education and History) and six minor courses (Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Santali, Education and History) for arts are taught. Though the college has 3 departments for science but only the Physics as a major course with Chemistry and Mathematics as minor courses are taught here.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEES

The college has a committee constituted according to Vishaka guidelines to prevent and take appropriate action against sexual harassment of women in the workplace. This committee headed by the Principal has both male and female representatives from teaching as well as non-teaching staff. UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA) 2023

Government General Degree College at Ranibandh has an active UBA team. We have adopted total 5 villages namely, Banshdiha, Jhilimili, Churku, Ramgar and Muchikata. We have successfully conducted some awareness campaigns: Plastic Free Zone, Water



Conservation and Dengue prevention campaigns in the five villages that we have adopted for Unnata Bharat Abhiyan.

For 'Plastic Free Zone' campaign we have visited those villages and instructed the villagers clearly as how to prohibit single use plastic products like water bottles, coffee cups, plastic bags, polystyrene foam items, etc. and made them understand the harmful effects of plastic pollution and its effect on environment and on us. We have

also instructed them on how to avoid plastics and look for alternatives like using jute, cloth or paper bags, and suggested to at least reuse them as many times as they can before disposing the plastics off if they had to use plastics.

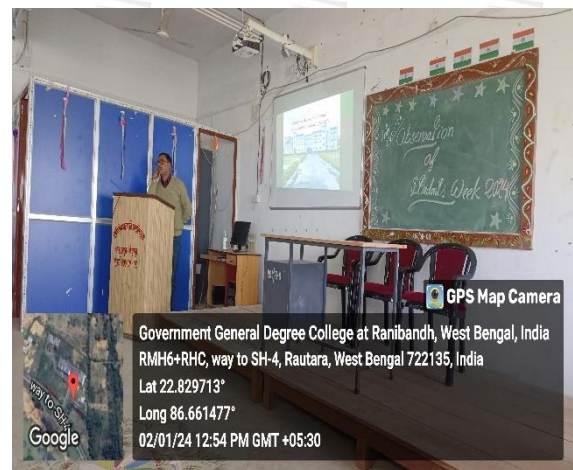
Also, on the occasion of Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar 200th birth anniversary, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and Government General Degree College Ranibandh (NSS Unit-1) organized an awareness campaign to discourage the use of single-use plastic. This movement was carried out as a part of a broader campaign nationwide, initiated by Honorable prime Minister of India of single use plastic by 2020. As early morning we started procession from our college to nearby out side village. Our students, teaching faculty and non-teaching are happily participated the procession, and finally the end of procession we got gathering our conference room, our Principal sir delivered awareness lecture about disadvantage of using plastic bags and also delivered lecture about the memory of our national hero Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar.

For Water Conservation we have come to understand that the villagers solely depend on tube well and pumping for their daily need of water and farming due to the lack of both water conservation knowledge and absence of water reservoir. We have communicated and instructed through different programmes as to how reduce the unnecessary wastage of water and the recycling of water to maintain the underground water level as per the process of "earth keeping" by conserving rain water by digging ponds, lakes, canals, etc. we also understand that to conserve the underground water level, the villagers are in a dire need of water reservoirs.

SEMINAR

To impart "Quality Education" to the students' community and equip the teachers to handle various academic activities more effectively, the college conducts Seminars & Workshops according to the needs of the students, staff and the teaching fraternity. Besides these, faculty seminar (departmental wise) is being held every month. These programmes offer class room teaching and provide students with opportunities to listen to and interact with the renowned speakers from various fields, to improve their communication skill, and to get exposure to a varied mode of teaching and to enrich their capability. These activities, help generating social awareness among the students too. Students are also encouraged to present papers in seminars.

During the pandemic situation our college has also organized a two days international webinar enriched by national and international level renowned speakers.

CODE OF CONDUCT

PERCENTAGE OF ATTENDANCE

A student must secure minimum 75% attendance (separately in theoretical and practical classes where applicable) in an academic Year. Having failed to carry out 75% attendance in an academic year, a student could not appear in the University Examination. The college may consider a student for the examination with below 75% attendance on medical ground only.

IDENTITY CARD

After admission, a student is required to get an identity card signed by the Officer-in-Charge of the college, containing information about the student concerned. The identity card is a proof of his/her status as a student of Government General Degree College at Ranibandh. The possession of this card entitles him/her to the rightful privilege as a

student of this College. The loss of college identity card should be reported to the college office.

LIBRARY CARD

After Admission, a student is required to get a library card signed by the librarian of the college for issuing books from the college library. The application form for library card is distributed from the college office or library office. After filling up the application form a student should submit it to the college office. The Library Card will be issued days. The loss of library card should be from the college library after few reported to the librarian.

ACADEMIC SESSION

- (5) 2 (two) weeks preparatory leave shall be provided before each Semester examination.

THE CENTRAL LIBRARY FACILITIES

To create a culture of self-learning and reading habit and to provide access to knowledge and information, the college library is furnished with books, resources of information, magazines, newspapers etc. The college library is fully automated with Koha software. Our library boasts an extensive collection of 8,768 books encompassing various genres, subjects, and interests. We strive to provide diverse resources to cater to the academic needs and interests of all our patrons. To spread the horizon of students' minds the library is provided with books for further reading. A spacious reading room accommodating 32 people is designed to help students develop effective study habits. To make the library more student friendly, there is a small digital library for the use of computers and internet connectivity for the students.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) Only registered members are allowed to use the library. Members should always bring their membership cards while using the library.
- (2) Two books are issued for first-year students, while three books are issued for students who have completed their first year, each for a period of 15 days.
- (3) If the 15th day falls on a Sunday or holiday, the book should be returned on the next working day without fail.
- (4) A student can reissue a book a maximum of two (2) times.
- (5) A book may be reissued for a second time immediately after its return if the Librarian is satisfied that it is not requested by others.
- (6) No books will be issued during vacations.
- (7) Teaching staff can borrow up to 20 books at a time for a period of 2 months.
- (8) Non-teaching staff can borrow up to 5 books at a time for a period of 1 month
- (9) Any lost, damaged, or mutilated book must be replaced by the borrower responsible for it. If the book is part of a set or series and the volume cannot be obtained individually, the entire set or series must be replaced at the borrower's cost. If the lost book is rare or irreplaceable, the borrower must pay the current published price of the book.

(10) In case of a lost or destroyed library card, a duplicate card may be issued upon payment of Rs. 2/-

(11) No books will be issued to students appearing for exams.

(12) A library clearance certificate will be issued only after the submission of the library cards to the librarian.

(13) A borrower may be exempted from the provisions of any of the above rules only with written permission from the principal.

(14) Rules may be changed as and when necessary, by the authorities.

(15) Students must store their belongings at the Bag Counter before entering the Stack Area & Reading Room.

(16) General Reference Books (e.g. dictionaries, encyclopaedias), Subject Reference Books, Periodicals, etc. are not allowed to be taken out for home use.

Admission to Undergraduate Course as per NEP 2020

GENERAL INFORMATION

FOR ADMISSION TO UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE COURSES 2024

The National Education Policy 2020 aims to develop a multidisciplinary approach to higher education. This policy will allow students to choose courses from different disciplines. Undergraduate education will be of 3- or 4-years duration, with multiple exit options and resources to provide appropriate certification at various levels. For example, a student may exit right after the first year of graduation with a certificate in hand. If he decides to leave after the second year, the Diploma will be awarded for successful completion of 2 years of study. As usual, a Bachelor's Degree will be awarded after completion of the 3-year course and an Honours degree or an Honours with Research degree will be awarded after the fourth year of completion.

Credits earned at various levels of education will be accumulated in a digitized Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). Students can use their earned credits to resume their studies at that institution for the remaining years of their undergraduate course or enroll in another institution. An Academic Bank of Credit will be established to facilitate the transfer of credit for subsequent admissions to other institutions. So, there will be multiple entry options as well as multiple exit options.

The new curriculum framework will have the following features:

- i. Flexibility to move from one discipline of study to another;
- ii. Opportunity for learners to choose the courses of their interest in all disciplines;
- iii. Facilitating multiple entry and exit options with UG certificate/ UG diploma/ or degree depending upon the number of credits secured;
- iv. Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi and/or interdisciplinary learning;
- v. Flexibility to switch to alternative modes of learning (offline, ODL, and Online learning, and hybrid modes of learning).

CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME

New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020) for 4-years undergraduate programme(s) with “UG Degree Programmes with Single Major” only will be maintained for the academic session 2024-2025.

As per New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate (UG) Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020), the Undergraduate Degree Programmes are of either 3 or 4-year durations, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:

- i. A UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that a vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 40 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.
- ii. A UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study provided that a vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 82 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.
- iii. A bachelor's degree after a 3-year (6 semesters) programme of study,
- iv. A 4-year bachelor's degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 semesters) programme of study. If the student completes a rigorous research project in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research*).

*Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline.

BASIC TERMINOLOGY OF NEW SYLLABUS

1. **Semester** is a period of six months beginning from July to December and January to June of each academic year containing at least 90 actual teaching days.
2. **Credit** means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is equivalent to one hour of teaching (Lecture or Tutorial) or two hours of Practical work/Field work per week.

TYPE OF COURSES

(1) Major Course of 4 Credits each: Major Course is the subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that subject. Major Course Contains 14 Discipline Specific Core (DSC) papers and 10 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers. Students should secure $14 \times 4 = 56$ credits through core courses and $10 \times 4 = 40$ credits through elective courses in the major course.

(2) Minor Course of 4 Credits each: Minor course helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major course. For example, if a student pursuing an Education major, he/she can take Bengali/English/History/Sanskrit/Santali as a minor course. Minor course contains total 8 papers i.e. $8 \times 4 = 32$ credits in four years of study and each semester have one minor paper.

(3) Multidisciplinary Course of 3 credits each: All UG students are required to undergo 3 introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines like Natural and Physical Sciences; Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications; Library, Information, and Media Sciences; Commerce and Management; Humanities and Social Sciences etc. These courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class) in the proposed major and minor stream under this category. The multidisciplinary course contains total of 3 papers i.e. $3 \times 3 = 9$ credits. In first three semesters, each semester has one multidisciplinary paper.

(4) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) of 2 Credits each: Students should achieve competency in the English language and a Modern Indian Language (MIL) which will emphasize language and communication skills. It contains 2 English papers and 2 MIL papers for first four semesters. A total of $4 \times 2 = 8$ credits are allotted for AEC.

(5) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) of 3 Credits each: These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students. Students choose their SEC papers from major discipline. A total of $3 \times 3 = 9$ credits are allotted for SEC. One paper of SEC is allotted for the first three semesters each.

(6) Value Added Course (VAC) of 4 Credits each: Courses under Value Added are Understanding India, Environmental science/education, Health & Wellness, Yoga education, sports, and fitness, Digital and technological solutions etc. According to the

curriculum structure of the Bankura university, a total of two above mentioned courses should be taken in the first two semesters. A total of $4 \times 2 = 8$ credits are allotted for VAC.

(7) Summer Internship Course of 2 Credits / 4 Credits: All students will also undergo internships/ Apprenticeships in a firm, industry, or organization or Training in labs with faculty and researchers in their own or other HEIs/research institutions during the summer term. Students who wish to exit after 2nd semesters or after 4th will undergo a 4-credit work-based learning/internship during the summer term in order to get a UG Certificate or UG Diploma respectively. 3-year degree or 4-year honors students are required to do an internship course of 2 credits.

Government General Degree College, Ranibandh welcomes the students for admission in 3-years or 4-years B.A. / B.Sc. (Honours/Honours & Research) courses. Students who have passed Higher Secondary, ISC, CBSE, or its equivalent examinations belonging to the category of Boards approved by the Bankura University are eligible to apply. The college has 02 (Two) streams – Science and Arts - offering courses on B. Sc. course in Physics and B. A. course in Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Santali, History and Education. The classes will be held in the day section.

ELIGIBILITY RULE:

1. Candidates who have passed H.S. or its equivalent examination (10+2 level) in 2024, 2023 and 2022 from any recognized Board/Council/University are eligible for application.
2. (a) Students who have passed Vocational Engineering and Technology (with pass marks in Mathematics) equivalent to 10+2 or equivalent level are eligible for admission to Science or Arts in the First Semester. Those who have passed without Mathematics or without securing pass marks in Mathematics are eligible for admission to Arts.
(b) Students who have passed Vocational Agriculture equivalent to 10+2 or equivalent level are eligible for admission to Science or Arts.
(c) Students who have passed Vocational Business and Commerce equivalent to 10+2 or equivalent level are eligible for the admission to Commerce or Arts.
(d) Students who have passed Vocational Home Science equivalent to 10+2 or equivalent level are eligible for admission to Arts.
3. A candidate choosing a subject as Major one must have that particular subject in H.S. or (10+2) level and also the candidate must Pass in that subject in Class (10+2) Exam.
4. A candidate choosing Physics as Major Subject must have pass marks in Physics and Mathematics in H.S. or (10+2) level.
